In pursuit of its mission, the Association strives to provide a forum for interaction and sharing that fosters growth from our mutual experiences.

#### **OUR HISTORY**

The Alumni Association was formed in 2011 at the suggestion of the San Mateo Union High School District's Superintendent and former Capuchino Principal, Samuel Johnson, Jr. to support the school's fund-raising efforts. It took a while to organize and provide support for all aspects of the school. The current organizational model includes input from all the booster organizations and the school's administration and staff. Everyone is welcome to join the Association. The Association's Board works closely with the District and School Board on prioritizing and funding needed projects.

The Association developed a unique structure that provides an opportunity for all the booster organizations to come together. Each booster organization has a voting member on the Alumni Association Board. The board meets a minimum of three times a year. The Association is the non-profit umbrella for these organizations:

- CAPeople (Parent Teacher Organization)
- Drama Boosters
- Music Boosters

As booster group leaders change, the Association provides an administrative foundation assuring that liability insurance and accurate tax reporting are provided under one common tax identification number.

#### The Brick Tile Seating Wall



#### **DRAMA BOOSTERS**

A lot happened in the last year and a half for the Drama students at Capuchino High School. 2022 started with the production of the well-known musical **Mamma Mia**, a story told through hit songs by the famous 1970s group ABBA about a bride-to-be trying to find her biological father on a Greek island. The production was a complete success under the direction of our excellent Drama and English teacher, Michelle Lemire, and our technical director, Mark Johnson, attracting an enthusiastic audience of all ages.



In the Fall of 2022, Capuchino Drama presented **Clue**, a comedy murder-mystery (based on the iconic 1985 Paramount movie that was inspired by the classic Hasbro board game of the same name) that puzzled the audience while they tried to figure out WHO did it, WHERE, and with WHAT. This hilarious play proved to be a hit and was very fun for the students to put together and perform.



In the Spring of 2023, Capuchino Drama presented the musical **Head Over Heels,** a hilarious and exuberant celebration of love that follows the escapades of a royal family on an outrageous journey to save their beloved kingdom from extinction. This bold new musical comedy is set to the music of the iconic 1980s all-female rock band The Go-Go's, and it has a very challenging script that presents modern-time topics in a Shakespearean-style language. Once again, the students demonstrated their talent and commitment to the program while having a great time and delighting the audience.





To close the 2022-2023 school year, the Capuchino Drama Club presented **Knock Knock**, a one-act comedy that follows two delivery workers and the surprises they find behind each door they knock on to deliver a package. This play was directed and produced entirely by Capuchino students, allowing some of them to take on these leadership roles for the 1st time. The play was a success and a great way to end the school year.

#### **MUSIC BOOSTERS**

The 2022 to 2023 school year was an awesome year for the music program at Capuchino High School. The program included the Marching Band, Fall and Winter Percussion Bands, the Concert Band, the Color Guard, the Concert and Symphonic Bands, the Concert and Symphonic Orchestras, and the Chamber Singers. We started out the year with the Leadership, Percussion, Color Guard, and Band Camps in preparation for the competitions starting in September. The Color Guard, Marching Band, and Percussion Band performed and competed at SJSU Day in San Jose, the Irish Guard Invitational at Dublin High School, the Independence Band Tournament at Independence High School, the WBA Regional Championships at James Logan High School, and the Veterans Weekend at Six Flags.



The competitions were a great experience for the students, and they scored well!



In between the competitions the Marching Band performed at the football games for Capuchino. Members of the Symphonic Band and Symphonic Orchestra performed at the San Bruno Tree Lighting in December. Before the winter break, there were two Winter Concerts to showcase the Concert and Symphonic Bands and the Concert and Symphonic Orchestras.



Starting out the second half of the year, members of the Symphonic Band and Symphonic Orchestra performed at the Millbrae Lunar New Year Performance. The Winter Percussion and Winter Color Guard worked hard to prepare for the Guard Evaluations, and the competitions at Independence High School, James Logan High School, Oak Grove High School, and the championships and Independence High School. Both groups got great marks and did well in the competitions!

The Concert and Symphonic Bands, Concert and Symphonic Orchestras, the Jazz Band, the Chamber Singers, the Winter Guard, the Winter Percussion, and multiple soloists came together for great performances at the Pops Concert in March. The Capuchino Music Department hosted the California Music Education Association (CMEA) Festival in April with great success. The Concert Band came away as the only performers with a Unanimous Superior which is the highest mark they could receive and are now eligible for the state competition. To round off the year, the Concert and Symphonic Bands, Concert and Symphonic Orchestras, the Jazz Band, and the Chamber Singers had the Spring Concerts in May which included the awards night which was a fun event!
